the address on an envelope, noticing the details

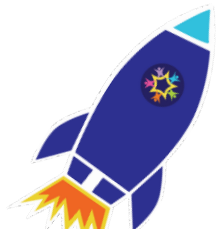
TALK

Read. Letters, words, picture books, signs, and labels can be found everywhere. Read with your child to build early learning skills.

Talk. Rhymes and conversations are building blocks of language learning.

Play. There are many ways to play - indoors, outdoors, with movement, games, and toys. Children and adults learn through play!

Sing. A parent's voice is their child's favorite sound. Sharing favorite songs is great for oral language development.

Research shows that humming reduces stress, induces calmness, and enhances sleep as well as lowering heart rate and blood pressure.

Playing with different sounds helps children to start developing their awareness of sounds and language.

B.I.N.G.O.

There was a farmer had a dog
and Bingo was his name - oh
B-I-N-G-O, B-I-N-G-O, B-I-N-G-O
and Bingo was his name - oh
(repeat and clap instead of singing the letter "B", then continue until all letters have been replaced with claps)

Old MacDonald

Old MacDonald had a farm, ee- yi - ee - yi - oh
And on this farm he had a horse
ee- yi - ee - yi - oh
With a neigh-neigh here and a neigh-neigh there
Here a neigh, there a neigh
everywhere a neigh-neigh
Old MacDonald had a farm, ee- yi - ee - yi - oh
(repeat with other farm animals and sounds)

Games, songs, and books using animal sounds and names help them hear, imitate, and play with sounds in spoken language. This skill set is crucial for learning language.
